(2)Course 0bjectives

This is an introductory course in corporate finance. The course has three main objectives:

- 1) Develop an understanding of the tools that are used to value investment projects and companies (valuation).
- 2) Understand the basic issues involved in how firms should raise funds for their real investments (financing).
- 3) Evaluate how investment and financing decisions are related. Emphasis will be placed on appreciating the limitations and chal-lenges that are faced when applying the theoretical framework

(3) Course Description

1) Course Contents

The focus of this course is in the area of financial management. We will show managers how to interface with accounting and finance departments, help them to understand how firms meet their financial objectives utilizing financial decision-making. This course will also explain financial tools and techniques, which can be used to help firms maximize value by improving decisions relating to capital budgeting, capital structure, and working capital management.

2)Course Design

Students should be able to:

- 1. Get a thorough in dept knowledge of financial management
- 2. Learn how corporations make important investment and financing decisions, and how they establish working capital policies.
- 3. Explain comprehensive core concepts in corporate finance

The course also lays a foundation for more complex financial topics that arise in additional elective courses in finance.

This course in financial management describes the corporation and its operating environment; it will help any future manager to understand how the finances of a company work, and how they will be interfacing with finance

This course is lecture based (14weeks lecture, 2weeks exam) All students are required to paticipate in all classes.
